Hill County, TX - As impacts from the winter storm blanketing the area continue to increase, Hill County and municipal governments across the jurisdiction are taking steps to provide emergency services. A federal, state and county disaster declaration has been issued. As of noon today just over 3,100 people were without power in Hill County and ERCOT mandated rolling blackouts were on-going. Hotels and motels in Hillsboro currently have power and rooms available, and several warming stations have been opened across the county.

"Many of the power outages across the county have been caused by traffic incidents. Driving conditions are treacherous. Our first-responder resources and power resources are maxed out. Please stay off the roads if at all possible, and do everything you can to help conserve power," said Hill County Judge Justin Lewis. "We're doing everything we can to provide emergency assistance, but Texas infrastructure is simply not built to sustain under these extreme conditions, and we all must do our part to help carry us through the next few days. I know Hill County will come through for one another, because we always do in a time of crisis, and we need everyone to help out with this," stated Lewis.

The weather conditions are also impacting government service operations across the area. At the time of release of this information, the Hill County Courthouse, City of Whitney City Hall and Hubbard City Hall will be closed for non-essential operations through Wednesday, February 17th. In addition, City of Hillsboro non-essential services will be closed through Tuesday, February 16th and status for operations in following days will be announced. Please check with your local jurisdictions for status of operations. This is only a partial

listing of closures known at this time.
